

Family Engagement Training

Family engagement training (UFEN) was developed in 2009 by the National PTA in 9 target cities to help create, train, and engage leaders, advocates, and parents who were in traditionally underrepresented demographics and who had students at risk of not meeting state standards. In 2013, the program expanded to include Lexington, KY.



Our goal is to help more families feel empowered by increasing their understanding of the role that they can play in their children’s education. We fully recognize that one size does not fit all and that there are challenges: families that don’t feel welcome, different cultural and ethnic norms and language barriers, misperceptions of the education system; therefore, we are reaching out as parents, advocates, community members to address these issues and to help increase awareness so that we can support the education of all children.
